Despite scarcity of resources, Region XI has registered a 98.31% overall performance for FY 2009 comprising the accomplishments of the Regional Office and its five sub-regional offices.

Demand Driven programs, projects and activities, which are interventions aimed at improving the state of local governance of local government units posted the highest at 123% accomplishment followed by Special Concerns, an inter-agency collaborative efforts at 102.13%. Internal Operations that cater to the needs of internal clients came in third spot at 100.55%. However, the non-negotiable PPAs for regional implementation displayed the lowest at 90.24% due uncontrolled factors such as non-availability of funds, etc .

Nevertheless, the overall high percentage of accomplishments were made possible through the collaborative efforts of the DILG XI Team, NGAs, NGOs and partner LGU clients in improving the quality of life of constituents in the countryside.

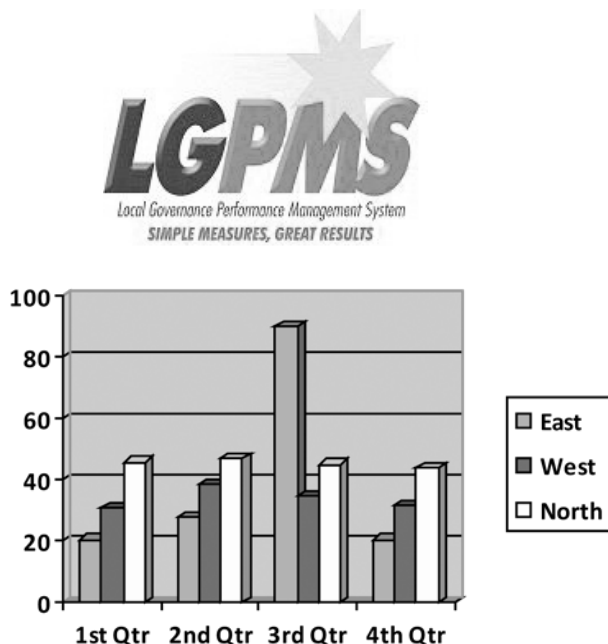

NATIONAL PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES FOR REGIONAL IMPLEMENTATION



The State of Local Governance Report (SLGR) 2009 presents a qualitative and quantitative data obtained in all aspects of governance. It provides information on the extent of efforts and resources devoted in the course of dispensing the local government's administrative and other governmental capabilities, in strengthening the delivery of social services, in sustaining the economic development and in enhancing environmental integrity.

In formulating the SLGR, specific data and baseline figures were captured through the use of a self-assessment management and development support tool which is the Local Governance Performance Management System (LGPMS). The tool is primarily designed to appraise the local government units through improved use of financial and human resources by benchmarking the state of development taking place at the local levels against established national standards.

Through the use of the system, local government officials and functionaries are provided with better appreciation of the strengths and weaknesses in service delivery of their local government unit and enables them to plan and implement appropriate courses of action to address the identified areas for improvement.

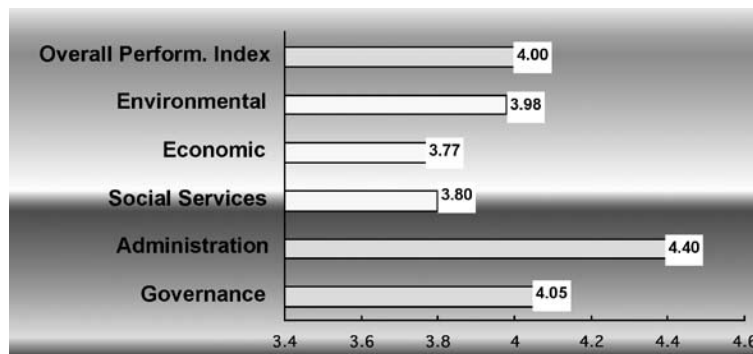
For CY 2009, the over-all performance rating of the local government units of Region XI is 4.00 with an adjectival rating of good. The rating is the result of the concerted and collaborative efforts of the executive and legislative offices and stakeholders of the 53 local government units of the region, comprising the 4 provinces, 4 component cities, 1 highly urbanized city and 44 municipalities.



Overall Average Performance Index

The performance areas on governance and administration obtained a rating of 4.05 and 4.40, respectively or with an adjectival rating of good. While the performance area on economic development obtained the lowest performance rating of 3.77 which within the benchmark level or an adjectival rating of fair. The performance areas that obtained fair ratings, such as economic development, social services and environmental management requires priority action and attention. On the other hand, priority for action and immediate intervention shall be focused on the following key areas: Economic Development (3.77), Social Services (3.80) and Environmental Management (3.98), which all got a fair or within the benchmark level.

PERFORMANCE INDEX BY LGU



The average performance index of the LGUs of Region XI for CY 2009 is shown on Table 1. Of the four provinces, Davao Norte obtained the highest performance with a rating of 4.06 or good while the lowest performance province was Davao Sur with a rating of 3.61 which is fair or

within the benchmark level. In all the 5 performance areas of the assessment and the LGUs of the region, Davao City earned the highest performance index of 4.60 or good performance rating

Strengthening of Peace and Order Councils

Executive Order No. 739, as amended by Executive Order No. 773 “Reorganizing the Peace and Order Council” was issued to establish a unified and strongly coordinated mechanism to carry a national program to address the current problems of insurgency, rebellion, criminality, terrorism or disruption of public order which threaten our national unity and security.

The DILG is the head of the Secretariat to the various POCs in the region, provinces, municipalities and cities, to handle the administrative and technical activities.

Regional Peace and Order Council

- o At least 94% of the POCs nationwide have been reorganized pursuant to Executive Order 739, as amended by EO 773, which provides for an additional membership in the respective councils.
- o With the new *EOs*, five (5) RPOC XI meetings were held, to wit:

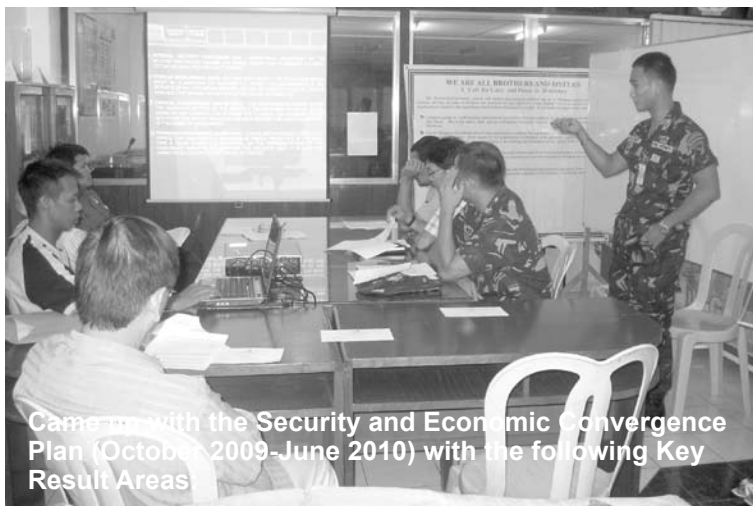

National Crime Prevention Week

Presidential Proclamation No. 461, dated August 31, 1994, declared September 1 to 7 of every year as National Crime Prevention Week (NCPW). This 15th year celebration focused on the involvement of the family sector in crime prevention. The theme for this year is “Labanan ang Krimen, Pamilya Patatagin”. The POCs at all levels celebrated the Crime Prevention Week in the region, provinces, cities and municipalities on September 1-7, 2009 together with the LGUs and PNP. Whereas the RPOC XI conducted the following activities:

1. Thanksgiving Mass at the San Pedro Cathedral, Davao City
2. Motorcade and the symbolic blowing of whistles along the major thoroughfares of Davao City, participated by PNP, LGU and private sector- KARANCHO



3. Bloodletting activity at the Regional Training Center, in coordination by the Philippine National Red Cross
4. Press Conference at the Philippine Information Agency (PIA XI) by RPOC members involved in the criminal justice system
5. Symposia at the public schools on Drug Abuse Preventions conducted by NAPOLCOM

SUB-REGIONAL POCs

All the four (4) provinces, one (1) HUC, 44 municipalities, four (4) component cities and 1,162 barangays regionwide:

- conducted Provincial and City/Municipal/Barangay Peace and Order Council meetings to discuss issues related to the maintenance of peace and order and public safety, terrorism and insurgency;
- formulated and submitted their IA/CPSP which served as a blueprint of the POCs on the areas of concern such as crime prevention and suppression, disaster management and control, environmental enhancement and counter insurgency; and
- monitored the implementation of Barangay Peace and Order Committees as the implementing arm of the MPOCs at the barangay level pursuant to Section 9 of the National Peace and Order Council Memorandum, Circular No. 2002-055 dated June 24, 2002.

Highlights on the actions taken by the respective Peace and Order Councils for CY 2009, to wit:

COMVAL

- o The PPOC conducted four (4) quarterly meetings and passed eight (8) resolutions
- o Extended technical assistance in the conduct of Provincial Peace Forums on July 21, 2009 and November 17, 2009,

respectively. It was attended by the mayors and barangay officials and tanods of the 11 municipalities of the province

- Reactivated the barangay police/distributed ID Cards and conducted inventory of firearms
- Continuous conduct of lectures and seminars on the roles, duties and functions of barangay tanods
- Conducted foot patrol and area operations to secure the municipalities and its neighboring LGUs in close coordination with local authorities and para-military troops
- Provided rice subsidies to military and PNP detachments



PPOC and Special Action Committee Meetings

DAVAO DEL NORTE

- Intelligence networking with military assets are properly coordinated and evaluated for proper action
- Strengthened the Katarungang Pambarangay through conduct of trainings to Lupon Members
- Approved the PPOC Resolution No. 2, series of 2009, “A Resolution Adopting the Provincial IACPSP of Davao del Norte”, on January 18, 2009.
- Displayed tarpaulin with HOTLINE numbers of the PNP, AFP, Mayor and Vice-Mayor as a peace and order campaign strategy
- Passed resolutions adopting the Anti-Criminality Action Plan for CY 2009 and requesting the Engineering Battalion of the Philippine Army to include some barangays under the KALAHI program
- Regular conduct of ronda and foot patrol to respective barangays
- Provided shotguns to barangay tanods as proposed by the Liga ng mga barangay, and as agreed by the MPOC Chairman
- Conducted a medical outreach program to 2,000 patients
- Facilitated the regular provision of food stuff and fuel support to the PNP, BFP and Philippine Army stationed in the province.

DAVAO DEL SUR

- Conducted two (2) PPOC meetings and 27 MPOC meetings
- Regular monitoring of movement/presence of armed groups and their revolutionary activities
- Augmentation of 31 PNP personnel of 67th Bravo Company to augment police force in securing the premises of LGUs

- Maintenance of fire volunteer brigades/volunteers
- Provided funding support to PNP for gasoline, oil and repair of vehicles
- Intensified Barangay Information Network with the PA, PNP and Barangay Officials

DAVAO ORIENTAL

DAVAO CITY

- o The LCE conducted command conference with the PNP Station Commanders
- o Established the Barangay Human Rights Action Centers
- o Provided security measures for the peaceful celebration of Araw ng Dabaw



Monitoring of Anti-Illegal Gambling Activities

The State condemns the existence of illegal gambling activities such as illegal number games as this has become an influential factor in an individual's disregard for the value of dignified work.

Republic Act 9287 is an Act increasing the penalties for illegal numbers, amending certain provisions of P.D. 1602.

The four (4) provinces, one (1) HUC, and 44 municipalities and four (4) Component Cities of the region conducted the following:

COMVAL

- o Continuous surveillance and operation against suspected financiers
- o Conducted occasional raid on the establishment of "pwesto" by PNP

DAVAO ORIENTAL

- o Continues intensification campaign on the implementation of anti-illegal gambling law/RA 9287 (*an Act increasing penalties of illegal gambling*)
- o The local officials and the PNP continuously monitored illegal gambling activities

DAVAO DEL NORTE

- o Conducted symposium on illegal gambling
- o Increased vigilance and campaign at the barangay level



PNP, DILG, BPLK and NGOs continue to patrol to areas where illegal gambling activities are rampant



DAVAO DEL SUR

- o Conducted pulong-pulong in the barangays and educated them on the root/result of illegal gambling
- o Conducted surveillance to suspected financiers and ushers

DAVAO CITY

- o Paraphernalias and bet money were confiscated
- o Mahjong set and bet money were confiscated

Anti-Drug Abuse Council Activities

COMPOSTELA VALLEY

1. Reactivation of BADAC and Youth Drug Watch in the Municipality of Maco.
2. The Municipality of Mabini conducted symposium on the causes and effects of drugs abuse, participated by 24 suspected marijuana and rugby users with their parents and guardians.

DAVAO DEL NORTE

1. Drug testing of all LGU employees of the Municipality of Asuncion.
2. Massive information campaign/symposia related to the ill effects of prohibited drugs were done in the three (3) component cities of the Province – Island Garden City of Samal, Panabo City and Tagum City.

DAVAO ORIENTAL

1. Heightened the campaign against illegal drug addiction thru conduct of pulong-pulong, symposia in the Municipalities of Lupon, San Isidro, Banaybanay and Baganga.
2. Monitored and conducted surveillance on the activities of drug dependents and traffickers in the Municipalities of Manay and Tarragona.

3. Strengthened the coordinative efforts between PNP, PDEA, CIDG and LGU
4. Heightened the surveillance and monitoring activities by mobilizing the citizen's participation through Barangay Information Network

DAVAO DEL SUR

1. Conducted illegal drug awareness campaign through Paglilingkod Abot Kamay Program in the Municipality of Magsaysay.
2. Regular reporting and intelligence networking in all municipalities.
3. In the Municipality of Bansalan trafficking of shabu was minimized but sale of marijuana seems to proliferate.

DAVAO CITY

1. The Mayor's Anti- Drug Coordinating and Action Center, a brain-child of the City Anti-Drug Abuse Council, proved to be an effective means of information and intelligence gathering. The Action Center has allowed the people of Davao City to have access to the Mayor or to a reliable custodian of information to whom information or intelligence data can be reported with confidence without fear of reprisal from those involved in illegal drug activities. Reports are closely monitored by the center to ensure that appropriate actions are undertaken.
2. Implemented RA 9165, particularly the provision on Random Drug Testing in Secondary Schools. The City School Board purchased 2,340 drug testing kits and DOH donated 1,000 kits for use in different schools of the city for the Random Drug Testing.
3. The CADAC through the Mayor's Anti-Drug Abuse Coordinating and Action Center, continued to receive reports of person involved in illegal drug activities. Reports received were forwarded and endorsed for validation and action by the PDEA XI and Heinous Crime Investigation Section of Davao City Police Office.

4. The CADAC, focused on its vision and commitment, shall continue to fulfill its assigned roles and responsibilities:

- *Focal point in the planning, implementation and evaluation of programs;*
- *Coordination of services and programs;*
- *Obtain funds, volunteers, facilities and technical expertise; and*
- *Perform other related responsibilities as may be assigned by competent authority.*

Barangay Human Rights Program:

Accessing Justice through A Gender Responsive Barangay Justice System.

The Department, through its training arm, the Local Government Academy, conducted a training on Barangay Human Rights Program: Accessing Justice through a Gender Responsive and Child Friendly Barangay Justice System on May 10-15, 2009, at the LGA, Los Baños, Laguna. This was participated by Regional Office and M/CLGOOs of capital towns/cities of the region.

The training is a capability building intervention that seeks to enhance the proficiency of barangay officials particularly members of Lupong Tagapamayapa in performing their mandated tasks and responsibilities towards good local governance.

The trainings were rolled-out to targeted capital towns/cities, where the participants are the Punong Barangays, Barangay Secretaries and selected Lupon Members, to wit:

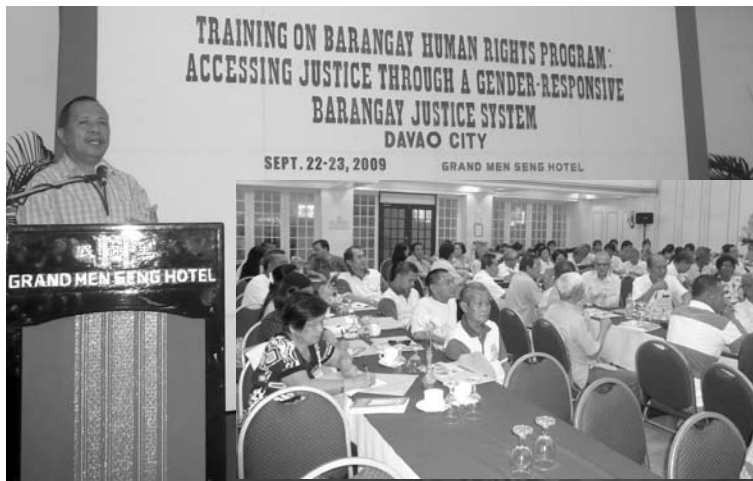
Monitoring of Various Leagues

Technical assistance and services were extended by the DILG Regional and field offices to various leagues and federations especially in the conduct of its meetings and assemblies namely: League of Municipalities, Vice Mayors' League of the Philippines, Philippine Councilors' League, PLEASES, Four L, Liga ng mga Barangay and Sangguniang Kabataan and Provincial Board Members' League of the Philippines (PBMLP).

People's Law Enforcement Board

The People's Law Enforcement Board is the central receiving entity of citizen's complaints against erring members of the Philippine National Police. The DILG provide technical assistance to the administration of cases. The local government units the region have provided funding and administrative support to PLEB for its continued functionality.

Republic Act 6975, as amended by RA 8551, created the People's Law Enforcement Board and provided for its jurisdiction in administrative complaints



filed against members of the Philippine National Police. The PPLEB is the central receiving entity of citizen's complaints filed against erring members of the PNP.

DILG Davao del Sur conducted skills training for PLEB Members, in coordination with the National Police Commission.

The three (3) PLEBs in Davao City representing the three congressional districts heard and investigated 26 cases for the period. The significant drop in the number of cases filed is attributed to the efforts of the PNP to improve their performance and character.

Joint Memorandum Circular No. 01, s. 2008 dated September 10, 2009 provided the guidelines in the review of locally-issued ordinances, orders, rules and regulations concerning public transportation so as to conform with the following policies, standards and limitations on the granting of the following:

- Franchises of Tricycles;
- Establishment and Operation of Public Transport Terminals;
- Re-Routing of Public Utility Vehicles;
- Issuance of Traffic Citation Tickets;
- Imposition of other Fees and Charges Affecting Public Transport Operation

DILG-DENR-DOT-PCSSD Joint Memorandum Circular No. 1, s. 2009 on the Management of Dive Sites directed LGUs to be consistent with the following provisions in the Management of their Dive Sites, viz:

- Imposition of recreational scuba divers;
- Permit fees and liability cash bond;
- Use of the recreational scuba divers fee;
- Managing diving related accidents; and
- Other administrative provisions such as the creation of a coastal marine management body

In compliance, this level issued a Memorandum on March 24, 2009 directing the field to conduct a Legislative Performance Audit Concerning Public Transportation and on May 19, 2009 on audit in the Management of Dive Sites, particularly addressed to the Island Garden City of Samal, identified as having a dive site. Based on reports received, LGUs have conform to the guidelines concerning public transportation and management of dive sites as provided. A corresponding report was already forwarded to the Central Office.

Continous monitoring on the Establishment of One Stop Shops, Installation of Customer Complaint Desks, and Simplification of Internal Revenue Regulatory System were still made until 1st quarter of 2009 in compliance to the Anti-Red Tape Program. To help the members create a more convenient way of interacting with MSAC co-member agencies, own clients, promote its services, increase visibility and post local announcements, the one-day hands-on training on website blogging was proposed and unanimously approved by the MSAC members.

DILG-XI Regional Director Quirino M. Libunao is so supportive with the training saying that “Blogging is the “in-thing” these days because it allows one to receive instant feedback and reviews on the services offered by each agency. Creating a blog for a business isn’t a want anymore, it has become a need. A need that has proven to be of low operational cost and high yields.”

On September 4, 2009, 23 MSAC members attended the web-blogging activity conducted by LGRC-XI with DTI as the resource persons at the DILG-XI LGRC Conference Room, Matina, Davao City.

The conduct of this activity is necessary for all MSAC members to create their own local website. This is important for the LGRC so that one can integrate and harmonize the various programs of different stakeholders, using knowledge to focus, prioritize, and align various actors according to a common image of regional Local Governance. 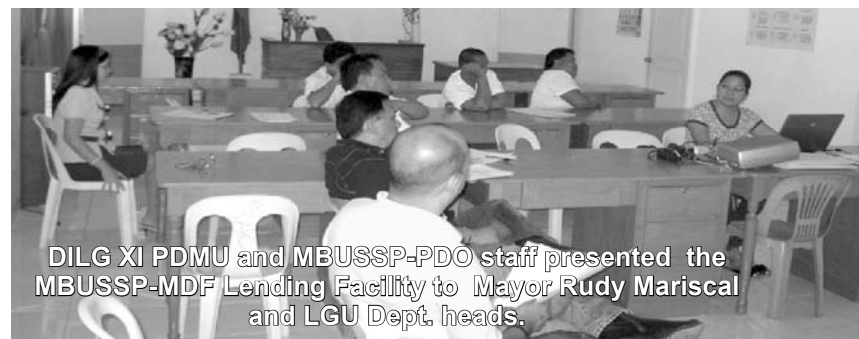

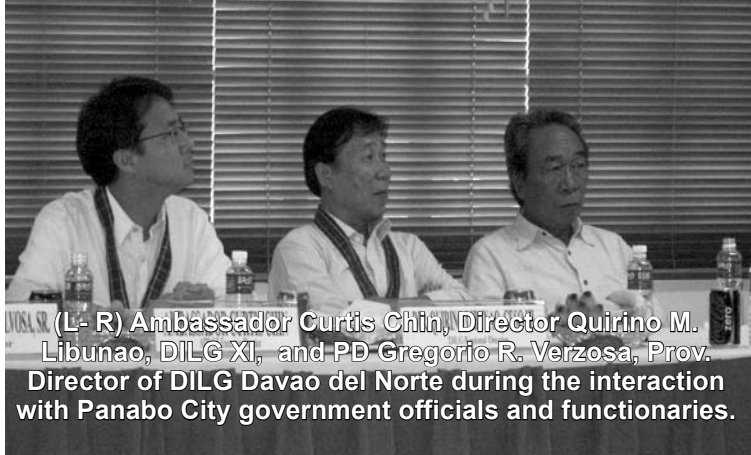

Republic Act No. 9845 (Anti-Red Tape Act)

DILG launches own Citizen's Charter

"This launching is our commitment to the government's mission of eliminating red tape and averting graft and corruption in our agency," Regional Director Quirino M. Libunao declared in his opening message at the launch of the DILG Citizen's Charter billboard on June 29, 2009 at DILG-XI main lobby, Matina, Davao City.

Republic Act No. 9485, otherwise known as the "Anti-Red Tape Act of 2007 (ARTA)" and its Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR), mandates all government agencies including the Local Government Units (LGUs) to come up with their respective Citizens' Charter in the form of service manuals and information billboards, which shall be posted at the main entrance of the office or at any conspicuous place in the office.

With the citizens' charter, the public can clearly follow the steps of the services offered, and easily identify the deficiencies in the given system.

The DILG-XI Citizen's Charter contains the Mandate, Vision, Mission and the frontline services offered by the office to the transacting public. One can find the following information in the billboard, viz:

1. The different frontline services;
2. Person/s who may avail of a particular service ;
3. The division/unit in-charge for each step/service; and
4. The duration or maximum time to conclude the process

The Public Assistance Center has also been set up and feedback mechanism were established, such as the Feedback Drop Box wherein the clients may drop-in their complaints, recommendations for improvements, inquiries as well as commendations if they are satisfied with the job rendered by an employee of the agency.

The launching was attended by DILG top management and staff, invited guests such as Regional Director Annabelle Rosell of the CSC-XI and her staff as well as friends from the media.
